Feast of Christ the King

- 1. **Sign of the cross**
- 2. **Gospel: Luke 23:35-43**

“Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom.”



And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, “He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!” The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, “If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!” There was also an inscription over him, “This is the King of the Jews.” One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, “Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!” But the other rebuked him, saying, “Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? 

- establish effective programs and reallocate resources to where they are needed.



UNIFORMS

Parents please be sure your children are wearing the appropriate bottoms. A dockers style pant is the only pant students should be wearing. Teachers will be checking students for the proper uniform. It is imperative that everyone is dressed appropriately. School gym shorts are not part of the uniform and neither are leggings.



School patches are available from the school. The price of them is \$4 each. You can order them through cash online and they will be sent home with your child.

PARKING/DROPPING OFF STUDENTS



As part of our continued School Travel Plan, the parking lot will be off limits to private vehicles and only available for school bus access and staff parking. This will alleviate parking issues and make the school grounds safer for all. Your continued cooperation is encouraged as it is for the safety of our children.

To avoid a potential hazard, we are no longer allowing **any parent to drive into the parking lot after 8:45 am or 3:15 pm**. Children are walking through the parking lot to get to or from the sidewalks and moving vehicles in the lot present a potential problem. We are asking all parents to **PLEASE REFRAIN FROM PARKING IN THE SCHOOL PARKING LOT BEFORE OR AFTER SCHOOL**. No vehicle will be allowed to drive out of our parking lot until after the bell at **9:15am in the morning until 3:45pm** in the afternoon. Let us go green and park on the side streets and encourage your children to walk a block or two to school with you.

PLEASE DO NOT HARASS THE STAFF MEMBERS WHO ARE ONLY TRYING TO KEEP US ALL SAFE!

As safety is our primary concern, a dangerous situation occurs when many cars try to move into the parking lot and block the entrance way or stop in front of the school in the **No Stopping Area**. Please do not block the roadway, especially as the school bus tries to enter. Also, do not stop to drop children at the stop signs on the street in front of the school as cars find it difficult to see children at these intersections. Please help us alleviate this ongoing problem and keep our students safe!

TVO MATHIFY FORMALLY HOMEWORK HELP



MATHIFY is an innovative platform provided by TVO and the Ontario Ministry of Education. This site focuses on mathematical help for Ontario students. It is an enriched online classroom tool providing a seamless learning experience for students, as well as providing live math tutoring with math teachers. Tutors are available online Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and on Sunday from 3:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

This Ministry and HWCDSB initiative are part of an effort to fill the gap in learning and strengthen mathematical skills. The involvement and usage of the Mathify support will be tracked to measure its usage and effectiveness. Please encourage your children to use it.


