PROCEDURES AND PROTOCOLS

In order to keep everyone safe and healthy we have made some changes

to the procedures and protocols for a smooth transition back to school.

Our School Day schedule:

Supervision begins on the yard at 9:00 am

Bell Rings at 9:15 First Period: 9:15-9:45 Second Period: 9:45-10:25

Recess: 10:25-10:40

Period Three: 10:40-11:20 Period Four: 11:20-12:00 LUNCH: 12:00-12:50 Period Five: 12:50-1:30 Period Six: 1:30-2:10

Recess: 2:10-2:25 Period Seven: 2:25-3:05 Period Eight: 3:05-3:35

Supervision for the Kindergarten Students begins at 9:00 Please kiss your child and drop them off in the gated yard.

There should be <u>no students at school before 9:00 am</u> as there will be no supervision available.

We are encouraging all students to use ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION (walking, biking, rolling) to reduce the vehicle congestion at our school.

Dismissal is at 3:35 pm for all students:

Students will be dismissed from their respective doors and can proceed to meet you.

Students are strongly encouraged to leave their precious and personal items at home, only bringing to school what is necessary for their learning.

Students will be encouraged to wash their hands before and after eating. They are also encouraged to use hand sanitizer freely and as needed

PARKING/DROPPING OFF STUDENTS



As part of our continued School Travel Plan, the parking lot will be off limits to private vehicles and only available for school bus access and staff parking. This will alleviate parking issues and make the school grounds safer for all. Your continued cooperation is encouraged as it is for the safety of our children. To avoid a potential hazard, no parents can drive into the parking lot after

8:45 am or 3:15 pm. Children are walking through the parking lot to get to or from the sidewalks and moving vehicles in the lot present a potential problem. We are asking all parents to PLEASE REFRAIN FROM PARKING IN THE SCHOOL PARKING LOT BEFORE OR AFTER SCHOOL. No vehicle will be allowed to drive out of our parking lot until after the bell at 9:15 am in the morning until 3:45 pm in the afternoon. Let us go green and park on the side streets and encourage your children to walk a block or two to school with you.

As safety is our primary concern, a dangerous situation occurs when many cars try to move into the parking lot and block the entrance way or stop in front of the school in the No Stopping Area. Please do not block the roadway, especially as the school bus tries to enter. Also, do not stop to drop children at the stop signs on the street in front of the school as cars find it difficult to see children at these intersections. Please help us alleviate this ongoing problem and keep our students safe!

CHILDREN PLAYING ON THE FRONT LAWN BY THE PARKING LOT



Please refrain from allowing your kindergarten children to play on the front lawn by the parking lot while waiting for older siblings. The buses come through the lot and children playing in that area present a distraction as well as a dangerous situation with them running back and forth while using equipment. Please take your children off to the side grassed area and let them play there while you wait. We want to ensure the safety of all. Thanking you in advance for your cooperation.

NEWS FROM KINDERGARTEN



We are off to a wonderful start to the school year. We are asking for parents' help in transitioning their child upon drop-off and pick-up routines. Please make these times quick and efficient. A quick goodbye kiss and hug in the morning. In addition, a quick exit from the kindergarten yard as the daycare is eagerly waiting to use equipment and must wait for the yard to clear. Your child has had opportunities to play in the yard with equipment throughout the day and is encouraged to exit the yard with you at dismissal time.


It's Yellow Day on Wednesday, October 4th!






